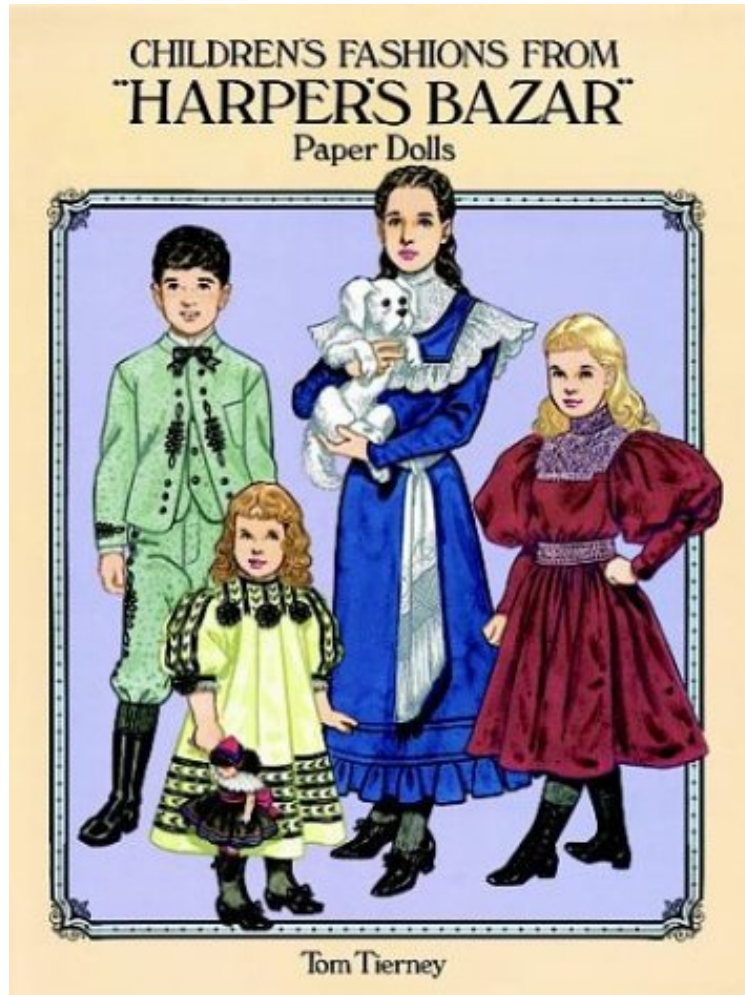

How youngsters were dressedBy ChrijeffLike Dover's Children's Fashions from "Godey's Lady's Book" Paper Dolls, to which it would be a perfect companion, this volume of Tom Tierney's wonderful historical-costume paper-doll series has tragically been allowed to fall out of print (though sufficient bombardment of Dover with e-mails demanding its return can't do any harm). Like the other book, it portrays juvenile fashion over several decades by way of the dress of a family of youngsters in comfortable circumstances--Martha, 14 or 15; Stuart, about 11; Flo, nine; and Emily, five--with two chief differences: its time span is 1869-1900, and its source is "Harper's Bazar" (the title wasn't altered to "Bazaar" till

early in the 20th Century), which was a higher-end publication than "Godey's." Ranging from simple pinafore-covered school dresses to embroidered eyelet lace, all are rendered in full color and minute detail, and because they're drawn on such a large scale, you can really get a good picture of what stylish kiddie wear was about at the time. Tierney even manages to suggest the texture of fabric by his skilled brush work. If you love historic costume, you can't do better than to begin straightaway to collect Tierney. (As soon as all my books are accessible I'm planning a So You'd Like... or Listmania! list featuring him, so watch these spaces!)
