There are some areas that, although not fully neglected, could have been given greater treatment. One case in point, was that a full chapter I believe, was given to the critical Battle of Milvian Bridge. There was one coin that was minted which displays what several numismatists believe was a depiction of the bridge where the battle was fought. There are some numismatists who readily disagree with this view. I think the author might have included it and left it to the reader to decide. Another drawback of the book was the poor resolution of the coin illustrations which did not offer the reader with the significant details which the coins provide. A final word that should be mentioned, relates to the declining years of the Roman (Byzantine) era. There were significant events that occurred during the final 200-300 years of this era, e.g. the invading Crusaders and their impact on Constantinople's civic and religious orders plus the emergence of The Empires of Nicaea and Trabzon which temporarily assumed the power and authority of the Byzantines while Constantinople was occupied by the Crusaders.

It is hardly surprising that such a potent force as Christianity has featured prominently on coinage the world over; indeed, coins have always played a significant role in all aspects of the Christian faith.Kenneth Jacob traces the connection between coins and Christianity back to pre-Christian Greek and Roman issues depicting deities. The wealth of allusions to coins in the Bible, particularly in the New Testament, is examined for evidence of specific issues and denominations: can we identify which coins were the Tribute Penny or Judas Iscariot's Thirty pieces of silver"? The growing use of Christian symbolism on coinage- the Chi-Rho monogram, the Hand of Providence - is shown to follow closely the history of Christianity. Coins of Constantine, the Crusaders and the English bishops all contribute to a subject fascinating for collectors and historians alike. Illustrations of more than 80 coins show the variety of ways in which Christianity and its iconography have been depicted on coins.Kenneth Jacob is a fellow of the Royal Numismatic Society and past-President of the Cambridgeshire Numismatic Society."
