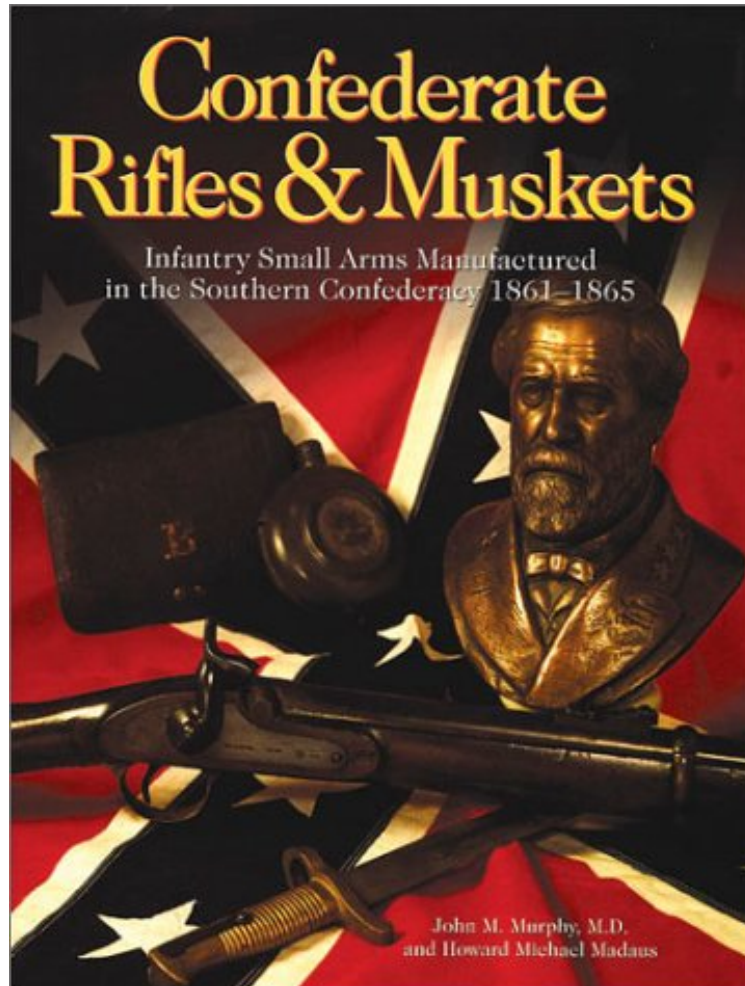


Confederate Rifles Muskets
