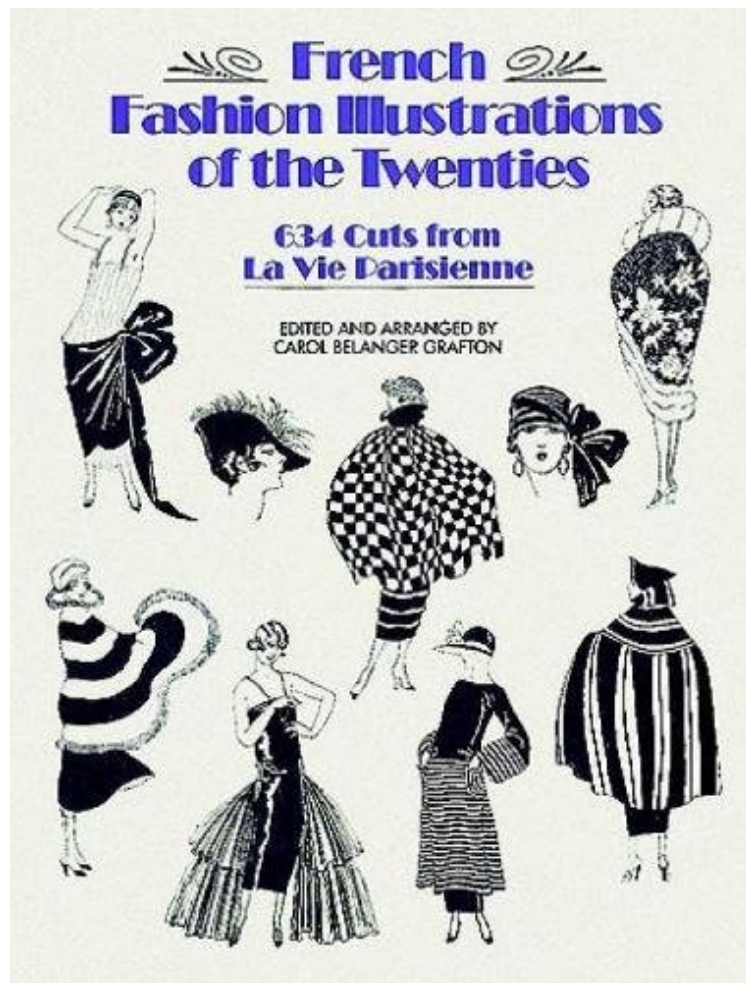

Parisienne (founded 1863). As the Publisher's Note points out, although “we tend to let the boyish image of the flapper dominate” our concept of '20's dress, she really “marks only the last few years of the decade,” and throughout most of it fashions were “feminine and sensuous,” their new simplicity of cut compensated for with bold patterns and abundant ornament—fringes, beading, fur trim. Hems varied from ankle to knee—sometimes the full range in a single year; hats were often of an astonishing variety of forms; and trims, trains, and accessories frequently created unusual silhouettes, both above and below the waist. From slim pencil dresses and “daring” bathing suits to parachute skirts and even a resurrection of the bustle, the outfits shown in these unsigned sketches, which are usefully arranged by year, are certain to be of interest to anyone who wants to know something of the less famous styles of this “roaring” decade.0 of 0 people found the following review helpful.
